### Reading: Isaiah 35:1-10

The wilderness and the dry land shall be glad; the desert shall rejoice and blossom; like the crocus it shall blossom abundantly and rejoice with joy and shouting. The glory of Lebanon shall be given to it, the majesty of Carmel and Sharon. They shall see the glory of the Lord, the majesty of our God. Strengthen the weak hands and make firm the feeble knees. Say to those who are of a fearful heart, "Be strong, do not fear! Here is your God. He will come with vengeance, with terrible recompense. He will come and save you." Then the eyes of the blind shall be opened, and the ears of the deaf shall be opened; then the lame shall leap like a deer, and the tongue of the speechless sing for joy. For waters shall break forth in the wilderness and streams in the desert; the burning sand shall become a pool and the thirsty ground springs of water; the haunt of jackals shall become a swamp; the grass shall become reeds and rushes. A highway shall be there, and it shall be called the Holy Way; the unclean shall not travel on it, but it shall be for God's people; no traveller, not even fools, shall go astray. No lion shall be there, nor shall any ravenous beast come up on it; they shall not be found there, but the redeemed shall walk there. And the ransomed of the Lord shall return and come to Zion with singing, everlasting joy shall be upon their heads; they shall obtain joy and gladness, and sorrow and sighing shall flee away.

## Reading: Matthew 11:2-11

When John heard in prison what the Messiah was doing, he sent word by his disciples and said to him, "Are you the one who is to come, or are we to wait for another?" Jesus answered them, "Go and tell John what you hear and see: the blind receive their sight, the lame walk, those with a skin disease are cleansed, the deaf hear, the dead are raised, and the poor have good news brought to them. And blessed is anyone who takes no offense at me." As they went away, Jesus began to speak to the crowds about John: "What did you go out into the wilderness to look at? A reed shaken by the wind? What, then, did you go out to see? Someone dressed in soft robes? Look, those who wear soft robes are in royal palaces. What, then, did you go out to see? A prophet? Yes, I tell you, and more than a prophet. This is the one about whom it is written, 'See, I am sending my messenger ahead of you, who will prepare your way before you.' "Truly I tell you, among those born of women no one has arisen greater than John the Baptist, yet the least in the kingdom of heaven is greater than he.

### Sermon

It has taken a long time for many in the world to wake up to the issues of changing climate and global warming. It has been known about for over 100 years but it is only in the last 30 years that it seems that some realized that something needs to be done and even more recently that some of the general public have started to take some action collectively and individually. What about in the Church? What should we do? Why should we do it?

For many in the Church the focus upon Jesus as our personal Saviour has dominated our thinking; we have recognized that God has love for us all as human beings. Yet, the God who in Jesus is personal Saviour, and, is the God who loves and cares for us all as human beings is the God of all Creation and cares for all creation. The God who calls us to love our neighbour is the God who invited Adam and Eve to be stewards of Creation, to subdue it and invites humanity to continue that role. To subdue did not and does not mean to dominate and destroy it but to take care of it with the love of the creator.

The Isaiah reading so links into the New Testament reading and the person of John the Baptist that we may not fully read, with due attention, the whole of the passage. Isa 35:1ff - The wilderness and the dry land shall be glad; the desert shall rejoice and blossom; like the crocus it shall blossom abundantly and rejoice with joy and shouting. The glory of Lebanon shall be given to it, the majesty of Carmel and Sharon. Oh how different is the desert of today? It stretches further, more dry and barren land when what is needed is fertile and flourishing land. Human activity and farming styles have destroyed once fertile lands, reducing them to barren desert. God desires that the deserts blossom with abundance. Last month COP27 met in Egypt and a further strong warning was given that we are overheating the planet; action needs to be taken by all to stop disaster through the destroying of liveable habitat for animals, and indeed, for humanity itself.

The Jesus whose birth we shall once more be celebrating in worship in 2 weeks time is the one who was involved in the act of creation and entered into that creation and loves it all. Each year I look forward to reading the prologue to John's Gospel at some point during the Christmas weekend. It is a passage that reminds us of the eternal dimension of Christ.

"In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. All things came into being through him, and without him not one thing came into being. What has come into being in him was life, and the life was the light of all people. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it. And the Word became flesh and lived among us, and we have seen his glory, the glory as of a father's only son, full of grace and truth."

And as Jesus mentioned in the Gospels God cares "even" for the sparrows; what does that say to us? "Are not five sparrows sold for two pennies? Yet not one of them is forgotten by God." (Luke 12:6) In our self-focused way we take it to mean how much more valuable we are to God. Is not the message that God loves the whole of creation as well as humankind?

Last weekend a Nativity Set Festival was held at New Road Methodist Church. About 200 "sets' were on display. In many scenes a lot of animals were present. Animals are not mentioned directly in the Biblical accounts of the birth of Jesus but we put them into the Nativity Story; surely some were there. There are the animals around the feeding trough that became baby Jesus' crib. Maybe some sheep followed the shepherds. The wise men probably travelled on horses or camels. Did Mary travel on a Donkey? I remember watching a School Nativity Play when I was in Lancashire and one of the children was dressed as a pig. Would you have noticed and wondered about it? When I was a teenager I attended a Christmas morning service and the minister was talking about how the animals in the stable might have reacted, the ox, the ass, the horse, the mouse, the pig. At which point Rev Frank Topping who was at the service called out "Derek, there would not have been a pig in a Jewish stable!" Maybe there would not have been a pig in the stable but the Bethlehem stable has room for all creatures and the whole cosmos: God loves every bit of it.

As people like David Attenborough reveals to a wide audience our lives are interwoven with the lives of the animals and plants which share this planet; their fate is bound up with our own.

In recent times at New Road, following a Lent Study started in Lent 2020 and finished in the summer of 2022, we have been looking at how we can be a more environmentally friendly church. Each year, in the October Property Schedules, there are questions about our use of Carbon based fuels, questions about what we have done to cut our CO2 emissions. At New Road we are looking to take these questions more seriously as we seek to become an Eco-Church, for there is room for the whole of nature in the stable

Which aspect of caring for the environment are you most passionate about? In this advent season, as Christmas draws near, what can we do to show a care for all of God's Creation? I leave you with some things to ponder.

- Choose wrapping paper carefully is it recyclable? Is it from recycled paper?
- Choosing gifts what is the packaging like?
- Do we buy gifts expecting one in return? What if the person we buy for feels obliged to buy one but it puts them into debt?
- Christmas crackers? Do they just contain small plastic objects that get thrown away?

In December Geff Harrison came and spoke to Dudley Wood Guild about his woodturning and wood art. He showed us some amazing pieces. I wonder how he would have felt if one of us had picked up a piece and deliberately broken it? How does God feel about how we are treating his wider creation? There is room for the whole of nature, the whole of the cosmos, at the stable. Let us learn to care for it all.
