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Reading: John 14: 15-28 The gift of God's peace

"If you love me, keep my commands. And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another advocate to help you and be with you forever— the Spirit of truth. The world cannot accept him, because it neither sees him nor knows him. But you know him, for he lives with you and will be in you. I will not leave you as orphans; I will come to you. Before long, the world will not see me anymore, but you will see me. Because I live, you also will live. On that day you will realize that I am in my Father, and you are in me, and I am in you. Whoever has my commands and keeps them is the one who loves me. The one who loves me will be loved by my Father, and I too will love them and show myself to them."

Then Judas (not Judas Iscariot) said, "But, Lord, why do you intend to show yourself to us and not to the world?" Jesus replied, "Anyone who loves me will obey my teaching. Action for Children – background

Thomas Bowman Stephenson is the founder of The Children's Home, now Action for Children - which has grown from its 1st home at 8 Church Street to run 650 projects and work with over 250,000 children, young people, parents and carers all over the UK. Stephenson was a Methodist Minister, as was his father. He was the sixth child born in 1839. He travelled around due to his father's vocation, and trained for ministry himself at Richmond College, graduating from London University. He served at Norwich, Manchester and Bolton before moving to Lambeth in 1868.

When he arrived in London he was shocked and moved by the children living on the streets, as a Minister he visited many. "There they were" he said, "ragged, shoeless, filthy, their faces pinched with hunger and premature wretchedness, and I began to feel that now my time was come. Here were my poor little brothers and sisters, sold to hunger and the devil, and I could not be free of their blood if I did not do something to to save some of them".

With Methodist friends, he came up with the idea of a home for young boys, where they would be safe from poverty and crime. Stephenson, Maher and Horner moved quickly and within three months of meeting, the first two boys were admitted to The Children's Home on 9th July 1869. They bought 8, Church Street, a disused stable for the first home. Lay Wesleyan Methodists, John Chubb, Sir Francis Lycett and Sir William McArthur also provided support.

Stephenson was determined that he wanted to create a home, not another work house and Mr and Mrs Austin were appointed run the home and be called Father and Mother. By January 1871 the neighbouring house had also been taken over with 29 boys living there. George Oliver, the first child to live there signed himself G Oliver No 1 for the rest of his life.

Stephenson's exacting views on child care also found expression in the creation of the Sisterhood of the Children in 1878. He had been influenced by the approach to child care in Hamburg, Germany, with children in small groups, but was concerned by the lack of a female presence. The Sisterhood remained an important part of The Home and continued up to 1985.

Stephenson also founded the Wesley Deaconess Order, wrote hymns and played a leading part in editing the Wesleyan Hymn Book of 1878 and one of the earliest supporters of British Methodism. He resigned as Principal of The Children's Home in 1900 and became Superintendent Minister at Ilkley. He retired in 1907 and died in 1912. By then over 2,000 children were cared for by what had become the National Children's Home and Orphanage.

Orphans, displaced and refugee children and children living in poverty need special care - Zechariah 7: 10 *Treat one another justly. Love your neighbours. Be compassionate with each other. Don't take advantage of widows, orphans, visitors, and the poor. Don't plot and scheme against one another - that's evil*

Children are blessed by God - Mark 10: 16

The people brought children to Jesus, hoping he might touch them. The disciples shooed them off. But Jesus was irate and let them know it: "Don't ever get between them and me. These children are the very centre of life in the kingdom"

In their most recent survey, Action for Children found that many families were already under significant financial pressure before the Pandemic and now their situation is deteriorating. Others who were just about managing and coping are facing financial hardship for the first time. As a result of these pressures many families have struggled to afford the resources to feed their children, educate them at home and keep them entertained. Some have also had to cope with adult and child mental health concerns.

Their recommendations to this Government are:

- Retain increases in the Universal Credit standard allowance; local housing rates; and England only Council Tax Support
- Increase Child Benefit by £10 per week
- Increase the child element of Universal Credit and Child Tax Credit by £20 per week
- End the benefit cap and two child limit
- Increase funding to welfare assistance
- In the long term they are asking the Government to implement a UK child strategy that sets ambitious targets for its reduction and eradication
- Establish an independent body to provide advice on the adequacy of welfare benefit levels.

Action for Children Covenant

Every child has the right to live, to be safe and to be loved. Every young person has the right to be housed, to have enough money to live in dignity and to have enough support for the future. Every young person has the right to justice, to realise their potential, and to be given the space to become independent. In an often cruel and imperfect world, we uphold the work of Action for Children with children and young people in danger, in need and at risk. We support the growth of this work and the pursuit of all these rights for the young, the discounted and the vulnerable. We make this covenant with Action for Children for the sake of all God's children. **Amen**
