Introduction to the theme

Before today's reading – think a little about all the places you have walked, all the different surfaces on which you have walked. You will have walked on surfaces that are easy – pavements... grass... hard sand.... You may have walked on surfaces that are slightly more challenging – soft sand on a beach....deep snow... icy pavements... rocky paths... You may have walked on a glacier.....in a desert.....on a swaying bridge over a deep ravine.....on a narrow ledge on a mountain....

But you will never have walked on water!

Reading: Matthew 14:22-32²

[As you read this – imagine you are in the boat – and you can hear the sound of the waves and the wind..] Jesus' friends were fisherman. It was the middle of a dark, windy night and they were in the deep waters of the lake, in their boat. The waves swooshed and the wind howled.

Suddenly, they noticed something strange on the water coming towards them. One of them screamed! Was it a ghost? Was it a sea monster? How could it be walking on top of the water? The waves swooshed and the wind howled.

Water was splashing into their faces and it was difficult to see properly. Then they heard a voice. It was the voice of their friend and master, Jesus. 'Have courage!' he shouted across the water, 'It's me! Don't be afraid!' The disciples were confused. They knew Jesus was amazing, but they'd never seen anything like this before! The waves swooshed and the wind howled.

Peter stepped forward and shouted 'Jesus? Is that really you? If it's you, then tell me to walk across the water to you!' Jesus answered him, 'Come on then!' Peter's friends looked at him as though he was

completely crazy! Was he really going to attempt to walk on the water? The waves were enormous tonight and the wind was tearing around their faces. The waves swooshed and the wind howled.

Peter looked straight at Jesus and clambered off the boat. He kept his eyes straight on Jesus' face. He took a few tentative steps right across the top of the water. The waves swooshed and the wind howled.

Suddenly, a big gust of wind threw a wave right up into Peter's face. He took his eyes off Jesus and started to realise that he was in deep, dangerous water. He began to sink. The waves swooshed and the wind howled.

'Jesus! HELP!' he yelled. Jesus held out his hand and pulled Peter out of the cold water. Safely back in the boat, Jesus quizzed Peter: 'Why did you doubt me? I could have kept you safe.' As the wind finally dropped and the waves grew calm again, the men in the boat dropped to their knees in front of Jesus. They had never, ever seen anything like that before. Surely he must be God's son.

Drama – Going Under⁴

- Jesus: Peter (No response from Peter)
- Jesus: Peter (No response from Peter)
- Jesus: Is it as bad as that?
- Peter: Mm-mm
- Jesus: But you've changed your clothes, you're dry now
- **Peter:** It wasn't getting wet that bothered me. It was making such a fool of myself. Why did you let me do it? Surely you knew what would happen?
- Jesus: What have the others said?
- **Peter:** They've been quite good actually, apart from Andrew who keeps making snide comments about webbed feet.

Jesus: Well, your shoulders are broad enough.

- Peter: It's not my feet or my shoulders, Jesus, it's my head. Whatever made me try it?
- Jesus: Well, you tell me, why did you try it?
- Peter: Oh, you know what I'm like. I take these daft notions. I always want to be in on the act and you made it look so easy. We all thought it was a ghost at first. I mean, treading grapes is one thing, but walking on water is out of the question. Then we realised it wasn't a ghost. It was you... and you were walking on the sea.
- Jesus: And you wanted to do the same ... eh?
- Peter: Yes, I did.
- Jesus: Why, Peter?
- Peter: A bit of me wanted to see if I could do it...
- Jesus: And a bit of you wanted to show off... eh?
- Peter: Yes ... yes, that's right. But I did manage it at first, didn't I?
- Jesus: Yes you did for about five yards. And then...?
- **Peter:** After that I don't remember a thing until I woke up in the boat with James pulling seaweed out of my mouth. What happened?
- Jesus: I'll tell you what happened. You stopped looking at me and started looking at the waves.
- **Peter:** I could hardly do anything else. There was a big swell.
- Jesus: Remember Lot's wife, Peter.
- Peter: Did she try walking on water?
- **Jesus:** No ... but like you, instead of looking ahead, she began to get fascinated by the danger all around her and she ended up being destroyed.
- Peter: I'm not sure what you're saying.
- Jesus: Peter, I've asked you to follow me. And you can only follow me if you watch what I'm doing and see where I'm going. And wherever I am, there will be trouble and opposition. There will be threats all around you and there will be distractions inside you... doubt...uncertainty...and all the old temptations you thought you'd left behind. If you keep your eye on these things, you'll go under. If you keep your eye on me, you'll stay afloat.
- Peter: Is it as easy as that?
- Jesus: No, Peter. It's not as easy as that. It's not easy at all.
- Peter: Do you ever feel like giving up on me, Jesus?
- Jesus: No
- **Peter:** (After a moment) Anything else?
- Jesus: Yes. It's high time you learnt how to swim.

Reflection⁵

When Peter kept his eyes upon Jesus, he was able to do something that humanly he wouldn't normally be able to do....walk on water. But when Peter took his eyes off Jesus and looked at the wind and the waves, he became afraid and started to sink....

Sometimes Jesus invites us to do things that humanly are not at all easy. Imagine Jesus asks you one day to go and share your faith with your best friend or neighbour. To begin with, while you are focusing on Jesus and what He is saying to you, you might think, "Yes I will do that. It isn't easy but I will trust Jesus to help me." But then you start to listen to the thoughts in your head, which are a bit like wind and waves. You might think things like: "I can't possibly do that." "I might lose a friend." "I don't want to make a fool of myself." Before long, you feel really afraid and you don't do what Jesus has asked you to do. If you had

kept your focus upon Jesus rather than on the thoughts in your head, you could have shared your faith with your friend.....which may well have been exhilarating, like walking on water!

On another day, imagine that Jesus asks you to give a large amount of money away to a Christian project that needs help. To begin with, while you are focusing on Jesus, your heart is willing to give that amount of money. But then you start to listen to the thoughts in your head, which are a bit like wind and waves. You might think things like: "I can't possibly do that." "I might need that money for a rainy day." Before long, you feel really afraid and you don't do what Jesus has asked you to do. If you had kept your focus upon Jesus rather than on the thoughts in your head, you could have given money to the project......which may well have been exhilarating, like walking on water!

So today, be encouraged to keep your focus upon Jesus. When He asks you to do something that isn't naturally easy, don't listen to the voices in your head, but keep your focus upon Him and enjoy walking by faith!

Response Time

Spend a short time reflecting for yourself on the story from Matthew that we have explored today. You might like to read these questions – one at a time – and consider your answers as you reflect on the reading and the drama.

- How do you think Peter felt when he saw Jesus walking on the water?
- Why do you think he wanted to try it himself?
- I wonder how the other men in the boat felt as they were watching...
- Why did Peter start to sink?
- Does this story feel like anything in your life?
- Have you had times when you needed help to keep going at something that was difficult?
- What helped you?

When we've lost all hope, and don't know where to turn, remember the words of Jesus:

Take heart, it is I. Do not be afraid.

When our faith is stretched to the breaking point, remember the words of Jesus:

Take heart, it is I. Do not be afraid, for I have redeemed you.

I have called you by name; you are Mine.

When you go through deep waters, I will be with you.

When you pass through rivers of difficulty, you will not be overwhelmed.

When you walk through the fire, you shall not be burned, and the flame will not consume you. For I am the Lord, your God, the Holy One of Israel, your Saviour.

Prayers of Intercession⁶

Let us pray....

Think for a moment of a stream, bouncing down the mountainside – clear, fresh and playful, sparkling in the sun. Nothing can hold back its enthusiasm. Let that be a picture of how you feel about the good and joyful things in your life – the people, the events, the daily miracles of nature, the details of seeing and touching. Remember when your spirits rose this week, when life felt pure and true. In the silence, be thankful......[*Silence*]

The stream bounces on, full of potential, but inevitably it runs into obstacles – boulders, fallen branches, accumulation of debris. We too run into obstacles that fall across our path – debris from our mistakes, boulders that were too hard to shift, burdens we have been carrying for too long. Name those obstacles in our hearts in the silence......[Silence]

We watch the stream, not always being able to force its way through the problems but endlessly inventive in finding another way – around, beneath or above. The love of God is inexhaustible and irresistible – in the silence, see that love carrying you over or under or around your personal obstacles......[Silence]

The stream is bolder now, fuller – and it is joined by other streams that have made their own journey and brought their own character as a gift to others. Who has God given to you as a gift? Who brings grace into your life? Who has brought you the greatest gift of all – the love of God – in a form that we can understand? In the silence, give thanks for these people who have come into our lives and pray for them that they might continue to radiate the presence of Christ......[*Silence*]

Now the stream has become a river, growing all the time. There are people in the water, struggling against it, clinging to the wreckage of their hopes, waving for help. We know many people who today feel swept away by difficulties too great for them to manage. In the silence, name them in your hearts and pray for them, that the Lord will lift them up and enable them to float safely in the high tide of his love......[Silence]

Now the river is broad, mighty and unstoppable, surging to the sea. We are caught up in the power and the purpose of the river. Who can imagine that it started as a tiny stream? The ways of God are huge in scale and irresistible in purpose. He seeks to renew the face of the earth and we are part of the plan – the river, the people of God. In the silence, rejoice in the certain knowledge that the earth shall be filled with the glory of God as the waters cover the sea......[Silence]

Lord of boundless energy, you refuse to be beaten – always reinventing yourself to achieve the impossible. Give us such confidence in your life running through us and through the world that nothing will stop you achieving your joyous purposes of love, life, hope and justice. This we ask in the name of Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**
