Reading: Revelations 2:1-7

To the angel of the church in Ephesus write: These are the words of him who holds the seven stars in his right hand, who walks among the seven golden lampstands:

'I know your works, your toil and your patient endurance. I know that you cannot tolerate evildoers; you have tested those who claim to be apostles but are not, and have found them to be false. I also know that you are enduring patiently and bearing up for the sake of my name, and that you have not grown weary. But I have this against you, that you have abandoned the love you had at first. Remember then from what you have fallen; repent, and do the works you did at first. If not, I will come to you and remove your lampstand from its place, unless you repent. Yet this is to your credit: you hate the works of the Nicolaitans, which I also hate. Let anyone who has an ear listen to what the Spirit is saying to the churches. To everyone who conquers, I will give permission to eat from the tree of life that is in the paradise of God.'

Sermon

Background - Ephesus was the financial centre and capital city of the Roman province of Asia Minor and its largest city with a population of 250,000 people. As a seaport city on the Mediterranean Sea, it was a centre for idol worship in Asia, hosting the temple of Diana, which was one of the seven wonders of the ancient world. The church in Ephesus had been established by Paul on his 3rd missionary journey around AD53 and he stayed there for three years. Timothy took over from Paul for about 10 years and then in around AD65 John became its primary leader before being imprisoned on the island of Patmos. John (who also wrote Revelation) moved to Ephesus and it's likely he took Mary, Jesus' mother with him. John, on hearing the words of Jesus for the church in Ephesus, must have had his heart leap into his mouth. Especially as he told him that he had this against the church – they had lost their first love – and John is the one who wrote about love in his gospel and referred to himself as the disciple whom Jesus loved.

Chapters 2 & 3 gives the church of today, tremendous insight into what the Holy Spirit wants us paying attention to and in these first few verses, we are encouraged to *return to our first love*. We are encouraged to *set our heart to love him sincerely and grace will multiply in our life* (Eph 6:24 – Grace be with all those who love our Lord Jesus Christ in sincerity). When you set your heart to love Him sincerely and grace will multiply in your life, what I mean by that is that you will be more inspired. Our love diminishes automatically if we do not reset it and rest it. Love does not increase automatically, we have to make the effort. The pressures that ganged up against the Ephesus church – and pressures that can gang up against us, when we try to keep programmes going or juggling life, is we can lose our first love – not we've not gone away from Jesus but he is not walking in our midst like he should. Jesus values and affirms the Ephesus church, just like he values and affirms us but he wants to be involved with His churches – he wants to be right at the centre but sometimes we push him to the side. And it's because he wants to be in the midst of them, that he encourages them and tells them how they can return to their first love – remember then from what you have fallen; repent, and do the works you did at first (Rev 2:5)

Remember – they were to recall how they used to love and spend time with Jesus. We are to recall His goodness and our past devotion for Him. They (Ephesus) left their first love, but not their hatred for evil. Do you remember when you felt the joy of abandonment to Jesus when you first heard the call to extravagant devotion? The Spirit will help us return to the freshness of our first love

Repent – they were to repent of this negligence by changing their life vision, priorities and lifestyle choices (the way they spent time and money) to pursue loving Jesus as the primary dream of their heart.

Act – they were to do the works or actions they did at first when their devotion to Jesus was fresh and strong. Mary (sister of Martha) 'chose' the good part by being at the feet of Jesus and staying in his presence instead of running around sorting out food or other household chores. We must choose it to be at the feet of Jesus. It was being in his presence that sustained her throughout life.

You get this right, and you set the trajectory for all the other things to be right. You get this wrong, you set the trajectory for everything else to get off. If we get our trajectory of loving Jesus first right, we'll be overcomers and victorious over the world.

In this time of our churches when our churches are shut, it is a good place to be at the feet of Jesus, returning to our first love instead of getting caught up in this event or that event, this meeting or that meeting. By focusing on Jesus, when we start to reopen our buildings our heart will be longing and crying out for his Spirit to show us what to do, or say, or act to become effective for God's Kingdom again.

So let us listen to what the Spirit is saying to his church. Amen

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Love Feast

Love feast or Agape meal as it is sometimes known is a Christian fellowship meal recalling the meals Jesus shared with his disciples during his ministry and expressing the koinonia (community, sharing, fellowship) enjoyed by the family of Christ. Whilst at this time we are not a meeting together, we are still an interconnected community so we participate together in this love feast expressing koinonia within the body of Christ

Dear friends, let us love one another; for love comes from God. Everyone who loves has been born of God and knows God. This is love not that we love God, but that he loved us and sent his son as an atoning sacrifice for our sins. Since God so loved us we also ought to love one another. No one has ever seen God; if we love one another and God lives in us and his love is made complete in us.

As we hold our biscuit/cracker we pause to remember those that we love...

As we take our glass of liquid we pause to remember those are less fortunate than ourselves...

Eternal God, in Christ you make yourself a guest.

Amid all our cares and concerns, make us attentive to your voice and alert to your presence, that we may know your love surpasses all else, through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen**
