The Lord's Prayer

Reading: Matthew 21: 33-46 - The Parable of the wicked tenants

"Listen to another parable: There was a landowner who planted a vineyard. He put a wall around it, dug a winepress in it and built a watchtower. Then he rented the vineyard to some farmers and moved to another place. When the harvest time approached, he sent his servants to the tenants to collect his fruit. The tenants seized his servants; they beat one, killed another, and stoned a third. Then he sent other servants to them, more than the first time, and the tenants treated them the same way. Last of all, he sent his son to them. 'They will respect my son,' he said. But when the tenants saw the son, they said to each other, 'This is the heir. Come, let's kill him and take his inheritance.' So they took him and threw him out of the vineyard and killed him. Therefore, when the owner of the vineyard comes, what will he do to those tenants?" "He will bring those wretches to a wretched end," they replied, "and he will rent the vineyard to other tenants, who will give him his share of the crop at harvest time." Jesus said to them, "Have you never read in the Scriptures: 'The stone the builders rejected has become the cornerstone; the Lord has done this, and it is marvellous in our eyes'? Therefore I tell you that the kingdom of God will be taken away from you and given to a people who will produce its fruit. Anyone who falls on this stone will be broken to pieces; anyone on whom it falls will be crushed." When the chief priests and the Pharisees heard Jesus' parables, they knew he was talking about them. They looked for a way to arrest him, but they were afraid of the crowd because the people held that he was a prophet.

This Word of God comes to us through the Scriptures. May the Holy Spirit enlighten our mind and heart as I proclaim the Gospel teachings. May the Spirit prompt all of us to respond to you, Jesus.

Sermon – Jesus the Cornerstone

The Parable of the Wicked Tenants is the 2nd parable of the trio. The structure of this parable:

- 1. The setup of the vineyard, v 33
- 2. The sending of the servants to receive the harvest
 - 1st group, vs 34-35
 - 2nd group, v 36
 - The Son, vs 37 39
- 3. The punishment the transference of the vineyard, vs 40 41
 - The unbelief/ rejection of the stone the cornerstone
 - Consequence ~ transfer of the kingdom

That was only days before His crucifixion, the Lord Jesus wept and mourned that His people had missed the day of their blessing and sadly announced:

43 "Therefore I tell you that the kingdom of God will be **taken away from you** and given to a people who will produce its fruit."

The word 'you' refers to God's people - the Israelites, those religious leaders, the Jews in Jesus' time. This word speaks to us today – all who are called Christians, God's children. We are the chosen race: the 'Heir' who will inherit 'the Kingdom of God'

- that through us all the nations of the earth will be blessed
- through us the Messiah will be alive in others' lives and to be a light to the Gentiles
- through Jesus Christ all people on earth will be a people of righteousness

All because Jesus is the Son of David, the King of the Kingdom of God. However, the Israelites do not believe; they questioned Jesus' authority (Matthew 21: 23-32).

By whose authority Jesus came into Jerusalem as a King?

By what authority that Jesus cleansed the Temple?

That Jesus 'drove out all who were selling and buying in the temple, and he overturned the tables of the moneys changers and the seats of those who sold doves' (Matthew 21: 12).

We must pray and ask the Spirit to help us to overcome our unbelief. Once we are in the house of the Lord, we are in. We must not wander between in or out of the house of God in a childish way. But to be faithful, commit to this relationship with God and with one another.

We must do all we can to live out the teachings of Jesus at all times so that our friends and family may know that we belong to Him.

Back to the passage

When God's people's long-awaited Messiah finally arrived, the nation had fallen into religious apostasy and did not recognise Jesus as Messiah.

They rejected Him and His teachings. They rejected the stone, the cornerstone.

They refused to believe His Word and even had Him crucified.

Although they were heirs of the kingdom, they had become a people who had wandered away from the Lord.

Jesus Christ, 'The stone the builders rejected has become the cornerstone...'

Can you imagine what the 'church' looks like when it is without Jesus Christ? It is merely an illusion for the people to believe that they are church or children of God if they are not the 'authorised' or adopted heirs of God. It is through Jesus Christ by the power of the Holy Spirit that we are 'adopted' and become the heirs of God. This is God's grace, a gift. This cornerstone is the key for our identity and entitles us to future blessings.

Matthew 21:44 Anyone who falls on this stone will be broken to pieces; anyone on whom it falls will be crushed."

The nature of stone – heavy and solid and hard. When a stone falls on our feet it can cause damage and hurts. When a stone is put in a wrong place and causes us to fall on it, then it will cause us to be 'broken to pieces'. However, when we put a stone in the right place, it will become a platform/step that leads us to a safer and higher place. Where do we put Jesus, the Cornerstone, in our life?

John3:17-18 For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but to save the world through him. Whoever believes in him is not condemned, but whoever does not believe stands condemned already because they have not believed in the name of God's one and only Son.

Jesus Christ, the Cornerstone of all people of God. He is a platform to lift the church up to the level where we may see the glory of God. God's intention to give us this Cornerstone to lead us to a safe place. Therefore, it is crucial that we help one another to place this Cornerstone in the right place within our church life...all the time.

Matthew 21:43 "Therefore I tell you that the kingdom of God will be taken away from you and given to a people who will produce its fruit.

God's heart is to lift us up so that we, the children, can enjoy the fuller view (joy, love, peace, kindness...) of life. However, if the children are continually hurting and damaging 'broken pieces' by this free gift – the stone, He will take away the stone from us to a people who are willing to put the stone in the right place in their life.

Conclusion:

This passage so far, has taught us that the consequence of those who reject Jesus the Cornerstone, will be cut off from the Kingdom of God. Those who do not receive the Son of God, do not believe His authority, will not receive the blessings. Those who do not receive & accept the Son as a cornerstone in their life, do not have relationship with Jesus, will be cut off from the presence of God ...from the blessings of salvation. How should we respond to God's message today? Receive the Son and enthrone Him as your King Receive the teachings of Jesus and make them your way of life.
