Reading: Luke 4:1-13 Jesus is tested in the wilderness

Jesus, full of the Holy Spirit, left the Jordan and was led by the Spirit into the wilderness, where for forty days he was tempted by the devil. He ate nothing during those days, and at the end of them he was hungry.

The devil said to him, 'If you are the Son of God, tell this stone to become bread.' Jesus answered, 'It is written: "Man shall not live on bread alone."'

The devil led him up to a high place and showed him in an instant all the kingdoms of the world. And he said to him, 'I will give you all their authority and splendour; it has been given to me, and I can give it to anyone I want to. If you worship me, it will all be yours.' Jesus answered, 'It is written: "Worship the Lord your God and serve him only."'

The devil led him to Jerusalem and had him stand on the highest point of the temple. 'If you are the Son of God,' he said, 'throw yourself down from here. For it is written: "He will command his angels concerning you to guard you carefully; they will lift you up in their hands, so that you will not strike your foot against a stone."' Jesus answered, 'It is said: "Do not put the Lord your God to the test."'

When the devil had finished all this tempting, he left him until an opportune time.

StF 235 – Christ our redeemer knew temptation's hour

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Sermon

I delight in hearing testimony, the story of how God has worked in the life of another person. It builds faith and confidence in me. As George Beverly Shea used to sing at Billy Graham's evangelistic meetings: "What he's done for others, he can do for you." The part that I'm not so keen on is knowing that the word "testimony" starts with "test", and that this is applicable to people's life stories. Every testimony has its times of testing. This was true for Jesus as well as many other famous and celebrated Bible characters. Jesus had his time in the wilderness, as did Moses. David, knowing that he had been called and anointed to be King of Israel, spent years fleeing King Saul. Read through the psalms and you will find much along the lines of "I was in trouble but you rescued me". That's testimony, in the face of test!

For Jesus, this was a time of hunger and temptation to misuse his power and thereby transgress divine commands. The devil's temptations begin with "If you are the Son of God" and then provide suggestions of apparently how Jesus could achieve his objectives with minimum time and effort. Jesus sees through them and realises that there are no short-cuts. "If you are the Son of God", was the challenge, then why not do this or that in order to achieve your aims. I have no doubt that Jesus knew exactly who he was... but do we know who we are? We are not divine in the way that Jesus was as God's Son, but are we secure in the knowledge that we are children of God? We can be! If you have given your life to Jesus and accepted his finished work on the cross then you can be absolutely confident that you are a child of God. If you're not sure of this then invite Jesus to forgive your sins and be Lord of your life forever. Surrender your will to his perfect plan. James 4:7 exhorts us: *Submit to God. Stand up to the devil and he will turn and run.*

Jesus wasn't alone in his test. He had two companions: the Word and the Holy Spirit. So do we! Note that it was the Spirit who led him into the wilderness in the first place. Jesus was able to counter all the temptations of the devil with words of truth from Holy Scripture. I believe that in order for us to reach our destiny we need both the Word and the Spirit. The Spirit gives us understanding of the truth as we study the Bible. The Word (the Bible) is a tool provided by the Lord to help us fend off temptations and overcome trials. It also nourishes us and makes us strong, releasing the blessings of God on our lives. Let me suggest four ways of making the truths of scripture our own:

READ - Reading the Bible is important but only one tool of many. Reading the Bible is certainly beneficial, but there's more.

STUDY - Studying is a further step towards understanding. It can mean following a theme that is relevant to us and looking at what the Bible has to say on that topic. This is not primarily an intellectual exercise but is to help us to live right. It can often be helpful, for example, to study what the Bible has to say about an area of life that is relevant to us, or a particular issue that we need to overcome.

MEMORISE - Memorising particular verses is a way of storing up truths that we can then access in time of need. It is how Jesus was able to counter the temptations in today's reading. He quoted verses that he had already learned.

MEDITATE - Meditation simply means spending time with a verse or passage of scripture, turning it over and over in our minds and letting the truth sink in and become part of us. The Hebrew verb (hagah) used for "meditate" in Psalm 1 can literally mean to mutter. If we can keep the word of God on our lips then it can feed and nourish us. Using our minds and even our lips too, we can keep a verse of scripture with us all day, whatever we are doing.

Jesus received the help of the Word and the Spirit. He taught, as recorded in John's gospel, that the Holy Spirit leads us into all the truth, and he will make known to us those things that Jesus has taught us. He reminds us of the scriptural truths that we have learned. In studying and learning scripture we give the Spirit something to work on, for our benefit. The Spirit helps us to use the Word not only to overcome temptation, but also to dispel discouragement, fear and negative thinking. The Bible gives us truths that bring joy and give positive direction, leading to peace and victory and wellbeing, what the Bible calls Shalom. This is how our trials turn to victory, our setbacks become the springboard to blessing, our temptations become a path to overcoming. In this way our calling and potential becomes our destiny and our test becomes a testimony!
