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Reading: John 3:1-17 - Nicodemus Visits Jesus

Now there was a Pharisee named Nicodemus, a leader of the Jews. He came to Jesus by night and said to him, 'Rabbi, we know that you are a teacher who has come from God; for no one can do these signs that you do apart from the presence of God.' Jesus answered him, 'Very truly, I tell you, no one can see the kingdom of God without being born from above.' Nicodemus said to him, 'How can anyone be born after having grown old? Can one enter a second time into the mother's womb and be born?' Jesus answered, 'Very truly, I tell you, no one can enter the kingdom of God without being born of water and Spirit. What is born of the flesh is flesh, and what is born of the Spirit is spirit. Do not be astonished that I said to you, "You must be born from above." The wind blows where it chooses, and you hear the sound of it, but you do not know where it comes from or where it goes. So it is with everyone who is born of the Spirit.' Nicodemus said to him, 'How can these things be?' Jesus answered him, 'Are you a teacher of Israel, and yet you do not understand these things? Very truly, I tell you, we speak of what we know and testify to what we have seen; yet you do not receive our testimony. If I have told you about earthly things and you do not believe, how can you believe if I tell you about heavenly things? No one has ascended into heaven except the one who descended from heaven, the Son of Man. And just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, that whoever believes in him may have eternal life. For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life. Indeed, God did not send the Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him.'

Reading: Romans 4:1-5, 13-17 - The Example of Abraham

What then are we to say was gained by Abraham, our ancestor according to the flesh? For if Abraham was justified by works, he has something to boast about, but not before God. For what does the scripture say? 'Abraham believed God, and it was reckoned to him as righteousness.' Now to one who works, wages are not reckoned as a gift but as something due. But to one who without works trusts him who justifies the ungodly, such faith is reckoned as righteousness.

For the promise that he would inherit the world did not come to Abraham or to his descendants through the law but through the righteousness of faith. If it is the adherents of the law who are to be the heirs, faith is null and the promise is void. For the law brings wrath; but where there is no law, neither is there violation.

For this reason it depends on faith, in order that the promise may rest on grace and be guaranteed to all his descendants, not only to the adherents of the law but also to those who share the faith of Abraham (for he is the father of all of us, as it is written, 'I have made you the father of many nations')—in the presence of the God in whom he believed, who gives life to the dead and calls into existence the things that do not exist.

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Sermon

Do you have a birth certificate? When I was working in Newport, South Wales I led over 200 wedding services. Couple often would ask me if I needed to see their birth certificate before I would perform their wedding service. I said I assumed that they had been born because they were sitting in front of me. The Registrars would have the records to check when needed.

Each of us, by the very fact that you are reading or listening to this has been born. We cannot remember our birth and therefore we do not speak much about it. Our mothers may have told us something of the time but our knowledge is second hand. What is more important is what has happened since that day. In our journey with God, when we are asked about our faith journey it is so easy, for some, to speak about the date, time and place of coming to faith, being born again as some would term it. Often that is what is told when people are asked to share their "testimony." That is all well and good, but what has happened since? What experiences have we gone through with our "God Family" to grow and develop, or have we just stayed as new-born babies in faith?

As I look back over nearly 50 years of following Jesus, how have I grown in faith? What have I been asked to do for, and by, God? What adventures have I had that I would not have otherwise experienced? What challenges have been surmounted through trusting God which if I just trusted myself I would not have started?

Abr(ah)am was challenged to go on an adventure journey. "Go from your country and your kindred and your father's house to the land that I will show you." How would you have responded? God added a promise. . "I will make of you a great nation, and I will bless you, and make your name great, so that you will be a blessing." At the time Abram was not a spring-chicken, I better be careful here, he is declared to be 75 years old at the time. Would you get up and go at such a request? If someone offered you an opportunity to start a new, better life tomorrow, the other side of the world, how would you respond?

In years gone by people were offered the £10 ticket to Australia to start a new life, do you know anyone who made the journey? In later times there was a Television programme called "Wanted down Under?" People had the opportunity to go and visit Australia or New Zealand to see what it would be like to live there. Almost 'try before you buy'. Abram had no such a time of trying he set forth and trusted. Around the world there are the Asylum seekers of today; the refugees from lands far away, wanting to take a risk for a new life, a "better" life.

Nicodemus was a devout man of faith but an adventure with Jesus was a big challenge. Jesus challenged him to start afresh, to be born again, born from above, born of God's spirit. Nicodemus had many questions to ask of Jesus. He wanted answers to his questions before taking the step.

Are we good at trying new things? Do you try new types of Food? New experiences? I remember when Anita and I were in Peru trekking one day we were offered some fruit. A type of Granadilla. When opened it looked like, as someone described it, "monkey brains". There was a mass of seeds surrounded by a gel. It did not look very appetising. Yet, somehow, I had a taste and it was gorgeous. When we returned home I looked for them and eventually found some in one Asda store, but it is a long time since I last saw one in this country to eat again. Sometime we just have to have a go and we may get a pleasant surprise.

What about Styles of music? New Hymn and Tunes? Different styles of worship? New ways of "doing church"? Abram stepped out and His faith was counted to him as righteousness. "Abraham believed God, and it was reckoned to him as righteousness.' (Romans 4:3). If God asked you to "go from your country and your kindred and your father's house to the land I will show you" how would you react? Would you excitedly leap at the chance? Would you reluctantly come around to it, given lots of persuasion? Would you run in the opposite direction? Or perhaps you're too exhausted even to think about it? How we respond to the unknown may depend on past experiences. Abraham had stepped out before, so appears quite ready to trust God and go again. Nicodemus needed more convincing. Both had great rewards to look forward to: many blessings, and eternal life. Are we ready to step out?

Today the last Sunday service is being held in Lawrence Lane – a day of sadness for many – is it a day when God says to the faithful people "Go from your country and your kindred and your father's house to the land that I will show you. "Is that what God may be saying to many of us, as individuals and faith communities. It is time to get up and move with God. If that is what God is asking of you, us, then it is a "risk" worth taking for it is accompanied by a promise and if it is of God it is no risk at all. The past is of importance for it shaped who we are, but the journey ahead is of importance for it shall shape who we shall become and shape the lives of others too. Perhaps it is time to "Try something new".
