Reading: 1 John 5:1-6

Reading: John 15:9-17

As the Father has loved me, so I have loved you; abide in my love. If you keep my commandments, you will abide in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and abide in his love. I have said these things to you so that my joy may be in you, and that your joy may be complete. This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you. No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends. You are my friends if you do what I command you. I do not call you servants any longer, because the servant does not know what the master is doing; but I have called you friends, because I have made known to you everything that I have heard from my Father. You did not choose me but I chose you. And I appointed you to go and bear fruit, fruit that will last, so that the Father will give you whatever you ask him in my name. I am giving you these commands so that you may love one another.

Reflection

When you sign an agreement, I wonder do you read all the 'terms and conditions' before signing? Or do you start to read them and then get part way down or lost in the legal language that is used but you still sign. What are the terms and conditions of following Jesus? Have you read them all? Do you know what you are 'signing up' for? Is there a difference between those of Jesus and those of the church (i.e. the organisation) to which we belong? Jesus terms and conditions are rather straightforward and brief: 'Love one another as I have loved you' and 'you are my friends if you do what I command' or as the Passion translation tells us 'Love each other deeply, as much as I have loved you' and 'you show that you are my intimate friends when you obey all that I command you' — and perhaps a few more similar phrases. Love and obedience are the essential terms and conditions.

In our English language, we use the word love for a variety of things. We say such things as...

• I love chocolate

I love my husband/wife/parent/sister etc

I love to listen to music

I love God

We have used the same word for love and yet in each of these statements, we mean something different. In Greek, they used four different words to describe the different types of love – storge, phileo, eros and agape. Although our New Testament does not actually ever use the word eros but it does use the others.

- 1. **Storge** = a natural affection between kinfolk or those brought together with a common bond. An example would be Romans 12:10 *Love one another with mutual affection; outdo one another in showing honour*
- 2. **Phileo** = the love between two friends a strong bond between people who share common values, interests or activities. An example would be 1 Peter 3:8 *Finally, all of you, habe unity of mind, sympathy, brotherly love, a tender heart and a humble mind*
- 3. **Agape** = the love that serves regardless of changing circumstances. Unconditional love. Often described as the greatest of loves. An example would be John 14:21 Whoever has my commands and keeps them is the one who loves me. The one who loves me will be loved by my Father, and I too will love them and show myself to them

Love one another as I have loved you or love each other deeply – of these three Greek words, it is agape that is used here. The love that is spoken of here is to be for another and to act for another, even at cost to oneself. It is the supreme act of giving. We need to remember, that love in the Gospels is not about a feeling. Rather it is being for the other and acting accordingly. Emotions are not absent, but they are not central. The primary canon by which love for one another is measured is God's love for the world – John 3:16 For God so loved the world, that he gave his only Son – and Christ's love which carried out in full and final obedience that love of God. If we want to know what love means in each of life's daily situations that we encounter, then we need to be abiding in God's love and being taught by the Spirit – John 14:26 'The Advocate, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you everything, and remind you of al that I have said to you' (NRSV) – and becoming a friend of God, just like Abraham and Moses in the Old Testament.

Love is not just the motivation but it's the content for all we do. Jesus kept God's commandments and we are to keep Christ's. Jesus made God known, he was bathed in the knowledge and love of God, he only did what the Father said. We need to bath in the knowledge and love of God too. The more we learn the love of God, the more revelation we'll have of God's heart and the more we'll be able to live out our life in a world that is at odds with God's word but nevertheless in need of God's love.

So, let us learn to live daily in the love of God, that we will get to know the Source giver who displays his unconditional love for us, and who will enable us to live on Jesus' terms and conditions fully - to love one another deeply.

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Prayers of Intercession

Leader: Help us to keep your commands and remain in an attitude of love towards others. Help us to experience your joy when we show your love. Help us to take strength in the joy that comes from showing your love. Help us to experience your complete and full joy.

All: 'My command is this: love each other as I have loved you.'

Leader: Father God, help us to love when it's hard, when we don't want to, when it hurts – because when we do that, we are showing you, because you are love in the complete and perfect form.

Leader: Father God, help us to be sacrificial in showing love. Help us to love until it hurts, and then love some more. Help us to change this world by showing your love to one person at a time. For as long as we have breath in our bodies, help us to show your love.

All: 'You are my friends if you do what I command.'

Leader: Father, help us to be worthy to be called friend – to our neighbour, workmate, or family member, within our school, workplace or community, help us to proudly wear the title of 'friend' and always be available and have time for those who need a friend.

All: 'I no longer call you servants, because a servant does not know his master's business. Instead, I have called you friends, for everything that I learned from my Father I have made known to you.'

Leader: Father, help us not to love and work for you out of some sense of duty, but rather help us to show your love because it is as natural to us as breathing. Help us to share not just your love, but also knowledge about you by what we do rather than what we say, and by people reading our actions as acts of love because we are loved by a loving God.

All: 'You did not choose me, but I chose you and appointed you so that you might go and bear fruit fruit that will last – and so that whatever you ask in my name the Father will give you.'

Leader: Father God, thank you that you deem us worthy to be part of the answer to the world's problems by being your loved children. Thank you for choosing us to live the unique ministry and life that you have ordained for us. Thank you, Father, for the fruit that we can bear in your name, and may all the glory and honour always go to you.

All: 'This is my command: love each other.'

Leader: Father God, help us in this great command not to feel obligated to act in a certain way, but rather to act freely and willingly to show love to each other as we are shown love from you as our heavenly Father.

All: Help us now and always to love one another, and to remain in your love. Amen.
