A focus on.... Family

Normally, I would be focusing on an element of childrens work here but I feel it appropriate to highlight the concept of families and their challenges. We know families come in many different forms and we know that adjusting to life right now is difficult for many families. Whether you are a family together or separated, homeschooling or are key workers with children in school or mourning the loss of a family member – life has changed.

Parent guilt is something I have wrestled with since my daughter was born. Most parents I know have expressed some form of guilt during their childrens lives and right now we are being tested in a way that is nobody was prepared for. Quick but life changing decisions have had to be made, Key worker parents leaving a child in a school setting, Dividing a day between squabbling siblings, homeschool work and our own work and parents who have relied heavily on grandparents to help are missing that vital loving environment that their child benefits from. I have read lots of theories and articles on this both satirically and faith lead and it seems no matter what we do - parent guilt will always be there – it's a sign we love them so much. So whatever you are 'trying' to do remember: Its enough, you are enough and will always be enough. I was reminded that children will remember this time for crazy fun they have with their family when time allows and not whether they finish Maths work or whether they have got a list of subordinating conjunctions correct – I keep that in mind as I try to work with my children and not against them
